Profile: Bachelor of Psychology (with Honours)

With mental health more firmly on the public agenda, the need for skilled psychologists to make a difference is growing.

"The Bachelor of Psychology (with Honours) prepares graduates to work to improve psychological and neurocognitive well-being and to conduct research that translates into societal impact," says course convener from the School of Psychology and Psychiatry, Dr Penelope Hasking.

For those wishing to practice psychology or become a member of the Australian Psychological Society, honours study is often the first step to a successful career in the field (access based on third-year results). Throughout the degree, students gain broad, interdisciplinary knowledge of psychology and a deep understanding of specific areas, such as brain injury, culture and mental health, forensic behavioural science, neurodevelopment and mood, movement and sleep disorders.

Students also work with those at the fore of research.

The course is a 4-year program, taught at the Clayton campus. Students can choose to exit at three years if they are not completing honours

Defence Force Recruiting would like to take this opportunity to invite students and their families to an RMC Information Night at the Defence Force Recruiting Centre in Melbourne.



All students in the course receive a tax-free scholarship worth over \$46,500, paid out over two and a half years of the degree.

A high ATAR is not essential. Academic ability is just one of the 5 selection criteria, so some successful candidates will be stronger in other areas than on ATAR. Each year UTS takes in applicants whose eventual ATARs fall in the range 85-99.95, so all worthy students who don't expect to reach an ATAR of 95 are recommended to apply.

Accounting Cadetships and Traineeships

Each year, final year secondary students have the opportunity to apply for cadetships with a number of Australian and international accounting firms. Cadetships and Traineeships involve working full time for two years at a firm while a student studies their university degree part time. This means that, whilst studying and completing their degree, students get:

- · PAID employment plus assistance with university fees and text books
- · Invaluable industry work experience plus study leave

Cadetships and Traineeships are offered to Year 12 students who are expecting to undertake a Business or Commerce Degree, with accounting as their major.

The program then allows students to complete their degrees on a full-time basis whilst being supported by the company and undertaking vacation employment with the firm.

Bachelor of Health Science at Swinburne University

The Bachelor of Health Science is a 3–year degree offered at the Hawthorn campus and was offered for the first time this year. This course explores Australian and international health challenges from a range of perspectives. Students get to choose specialised studies in one of four major areas: Health Promotion, Nutrition, Psychology, and Sport Science. Prospective career options on graduating include –

- Health Promotion graduates may be employed in jobs such as health promotion officer, community development officer, social planning officer, health educator, women's health officer, health policy developer, planning officer, and health researcher
- Nutrition graduates may be employed in jobs where knowledge of the food industry, food composition, processing and nutrition is required, including food processing industries; government food laboratories; food wholesale and retail industries; government instrumentalities in health,

nutrition and agribusiness, product marketing and food quality assurance

- Psychology graduates may be employed in jobs including areas of community and mental health, human resource management, policy development, research, welfare, journalism, marketing and advertising. This program provides the first step to becoming a professional psychologist. This major incorporates the psychology sequence accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC). After completing a degree with a major in psychology, students may apply to undertake a fourth year in psychology and then further study in specialist areas of professional psychology such as counselling, health, clinical, organisational, and sports psychology
- Sport Science graduates may be employed in jobs including sports administration, facility management, community health, and sport science, as well as traditional educational roles

The VCE entry requirements are Units 3 and 4–a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in any other English and a study score of at least 20 in Mathematics (any). Visit www.future.swinburne.edu.au/courses/Bachelor-of-Health-Science-H0639/local#overview to find out more!
